Course Description

Completes Intermediate Korean I emphasizing reading of intermediate texts and the spoken language.

Student Learning Outcomes

Write a detailed resume and complete a mock job interview asking about one's educational background; career and personal interests and goals (7 minutes).

Criteria

The resume must be typed and handwritten legibly. Must be prepared to give an extensive self-introduction and self-description including one's reasons for studying Korean culture and language, and one's career aspiration using deferential style and honorific, and conveying subtle nuances in connectives and sentence endings.

Rubric

Exemplary: The resume is professional in appearance and content with no orthographic error. All the information is accurate and formatted correctly. The student presents her/himself as confident in the Korean language, articulate in self-introduction and self-description. Also displays impressive knowledge about Korean culture and customs.

Acceptable: The resume is neat in appearance and content with no orthographic error. All the

information is accurate and formatted correctly. The student presents her/himself as proficient in the Korean language, manages self-introduction and self-description without any major

pronunciation or grammar mistake. Also displays extensive knowledge about Korean culture and customs.

Unacceptable: The resume is illegible and lacking in content with orthographic error.

Information is inaccurate or lacking, and formatted incorrectly. The student does not project confident in the Korean language, inarticulate in self-introduction and self-description. Displays limited knowledge about Korean culture and customs.
