Thanks to your support and the support of the community, the college is undergo-

ing a \$350 million dollar bond program through the passage of Measure J. Throughout our building program the college has been working with our College Citizens' Building Oversight Committee (CBOC). The CBOC is comprised of local homeowners, business and community leaders, students, and senior citizens. Regular meetings are conducted to keep the CBOC up-to-date on the improvements and revitalization of LACC. Information posted on this website is also provided to the CBOC.

LACC has undergone tremendous change with four new structures established. If you have driven past the college recently you have noticed some of the tremendous changes we have made over the past few years. Since 2007, the following projects have been completed: Martin Luther King Jr. Library, Consumer and Family Studies Building (CDC), Science and Technology Building, New Parking Structure with Maintenance Facility and Shipping & Receiving, Upgrade to Central Plant and new Thermal Storage Tanks, Franklin Hall Modernization, Jefferson Hall Modernization, Life Science Renovation, Chemistry Renovation, Demand Side Management Project and a complete upgrade of all underground utilities on campus.

SPRING 2012

Student Union Building

Student Union construction is 58% completed. Each of the major concrete pours for the foundation, floor decks, roof and columns have been completed and the building shell is fully visible. A campus wide survey to identify prospective food court vendors was also issued and the new food court is scheduled to open at the start of the Spring Semester 2013.

Chemistry & Life Science Buildings

22 classrooms were renovated as part of this modernization project. The renovation details included: the relocation of underground utilities, a new exterior elevator, bridge and stairs, new interior doors and the replacement of non-conforming door hardware, new floor finishes, replacement of existing ceiling finishes, interior and exterior painting, replacement of non-conforming toilets and restroom fixtures, new emergency exit from the Chemistry basement to ground level, replacement of existing boilers and roofing material, new electrical system, new power and data for work stations, new fire alarm system with fire sprinkler upgrades, and replacement of non-conforming ramps.

New North Gym PE Center

The PE Building is a 41,000 sq. ft. building with approximately 30 rooms consisting of a lecture hall, classroom, Judo Studio, Home team and Visitor Team locker rooms, showers, gymnasium, Training and treatment room, NCAA rated competition swimming pool, Fitness Center and Office Space.

With Measure J, and the colleges Facilities Master Plan the following projects are in progress. They include the following: Student Union, Physical Education Building, Clausen Hall and the Athletic Track & Field are all in construction, while DaVinci Hall, the South Gym, the Physical Plant and new Tennis Courts, Redline Project, Campus-wide Landscape/Hardscape and the ADA Project are all in design, pre-design work continues on the Learning Support Center and Cesar Chavez Administration Building.

In the Fall of 2012 the Chancellor of the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) implemented a bond moratorium to ensure the district could sustain new buildings upon completion of construction. If the moratorium is upheld all bond projects within LACCD will be placed on hold for one-year. In the spring of 2012 the LACCD Board will review the moratorium and make a decision on next best steps for the district.

Clausen Hall Modernization

The newly modernized Clausen Hall Building will be dedicated 100% to LACC's Music Department. This facility will boast new state of the art smart classroom technology. In addition to its special instruction classroom spaces for both PC and Mac electronic Music Classrooms, the Music Department will have access to over 35 practice and coaching rooms where students can receive personal time to improve their instrument and/or choral techniques. A very special feature to the building will be a beautiful Recital Hall with 189 seats to showcase the musical talents of LACC. All facilities in the building will be treated with special sound acoustics to maximize the musical learning experience.

Franklin Hall Modernization

Franklin Hall Modernization underwent renovation and was completed Spring 2011. Franklin Hall has 48 smart classrooms. The re-roofing is 98% completed and the students and staff are enjoying the renovated facilities.
