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This form is used to reprocess a student for a Cal Grant, Chafee Grant, or Middle Class Scholarship using the correct financial aid application, Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application.

Students applying for financial aid in California must complete either the FAFSA or the CADAA depending on the students' citizenship status. During the release of the California Dream Act Application for state financial aid, the federal government began the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. The DACA program will issue students a Social Security Number (SSN) to use for employment purposes only. The DACA SSN should not be used for financial aid purposes.

Students may assume that having a DACA issued SSN qualifies them as a U.S. Citizen or an eligible non-citizen to complete the FAFSA. DACA students who filed the FAFSA instead of the California Dream Act Application may have not been considered for a Cal Grant based on their response to the FAFSA citizenship question. The DACA program does not change a student's immigration or national citizenship status, but allows students to be protected. Undocumented students who meet AB 540 requirements that are in the DACA program should complete the CA Dream Act.

REASONS FOR APPLICATION CONVERSION:

Student completed FAFSA using DACA SSN: An undocumented student who completed the FAFSA using a SSN issued through the DACA program but should have completed the CA Dream Act.

Student completed California Dream Act Application, but student gained citizenship or permanent residency: An undocumented student who completed the CADAA but has gained naturalized citizenship or became a permanent resident as a green card holder. This student is now eligible to complete the FAFSA.

Student completed more than one CA Dream Act: An undocumented student who completed more than one California Dream Act Application. The applications should be merged into one application.

Student completed both the CA Dream Act and FAFSA: A student who completed both the CA Dream Act and the FAFSA. The California Student Aid Commission will determine whether student will be eligible under either the Dream Act or the FAFSA.
