CHEM 212- Organic Chemistry For Science Majors II (UC/CSU) - 5 Units

This course is a continuation of Chemistry 211 with emphasis on the remaining functional groups and aromaticity. Emphasis is put on reactions and reaction mechanisms, stereochemistry, multi-step synthesis of a variety of organic compounds such as aromatic compounds, alcohols, phenols, amines, heterocyclics, aldehydes, ketones, carboxylic acids and their derivatives.
