ROBERT LOUIS STEVENSON

Ushers.......First Semester Actors

The Scottish novelist, poet, essayist and travel writer, Robert Louis Stevenson was born on November 13, 1850 in Edinburgh, Scotland. He is best known for his evergreen works *Treasure Island, Kidnapped, Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* and *A Child's Garden of Verses.* A literary celebrity during his lifetime, Stevenson now ranks among the 26 most translated authors in the world. In his later years, he moved to Samoa, becoming very involved with colonial leaders and culture. After a trying creative dry spell there, he began work on *Weir of Hermiston,* which he considered the best work of his lifetime. At age 44, he died of a cerebral hemmorage and was buried in Samoa on a cliff overlooking the sea. Following his wishes, his *Requiem* was inscribed on his tombstone. It is still sung in Samoa as a song of grief.

THE PRODUCTION TEAM

Tina Kronis (Director/Choreographer) currently serves on the faculty of the Los Angeles City College Theatre Academy where she co-directed and choreographed Untitled Warhol Project and Within Us. She directed Seagull, and Anton's Uncles (both TMB adaptations of Chekhov) for the Academy, the latter of which was a National Selection from the KC/ACTF, and was performed at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. In addition, she is the Artistic Director and co-founder of the LA-based interdisciplinary theatre company Theatre Movement Bazaar (TMB), a company dedicated to creating original performance works. Led by principal artists Kronis + Alger, TMB's award-winning productions merge dance, theatre, and cinema, heightening physicality and remixing theatre forms to create provocative storytelling. Ms. Kronis is co-creator, director and choreographer on all TMB projects. Her productions tour the US, UK and China, and include an original dance theatre work made in collaboration with an all Chinese cast of performers, Poker Night Blues, and Big Shot: This Is Not The Godafther, a vaudevillian dance-theatre riff on the Godfather films. She recently directed and performed in TMB's latest production. Subliminal, which premiered at the Getty Villa in November 2015. Ms. Kronis' work as a performer also includes 3 shows for the Swiss mask-dance-theatre company, MUMMENSCHANZ, on Broadway and internationally as well as co-creating their upcoming show, You and Me. Richard Alger (Text) is Executive Director and co-founder of Theatre Movement Bazaar. He wrote TMB's Track 3, Hot Cat, The Treatment, Cherry Jam, Anton's Uncles and Model Behavior. He wrote and performed in the TMB's Subliminal, Monster of Happiness, Café Oublié and Dry Cleaning. Richard wrote and designed TMB's Poker Night Blues (translated and performed in Mandarin), Big Shot, Strange Beliefs, Cirque Picnique, and Dumbshow, and performed in the original TMB production of Watch. In addition to co-writing Anton's Uncles for Los Angeles City College, he wrote Seagull, and collaborated with Leslie Ferreira and Tina Kronis as text engineer to create Untitled Warhol Project. He holds a MFA ('13) from the UCSD Department of Theatre and Dance, and a BA ('07) from the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television. He is a 2016 recipient of the Princess Grace Fellowship- Pierre Cardin Award.

Wes Myers (Composer/Music Director) is a graduate of the Theatre Academy who has worked with Theatre Movement Bazaar on *Track 3, Hot Cat, Big Shot, Poker Night Blues* and *Subliminal*. He also collaborated on LACC's *Our Lady of 121st Street*. Past credits include Life Without Limbs' documentary *Verve*, several short films, and the musical comedy pilot *The Project*.

Valentina Tonini (Stage Manager) comes to us from Italy, where she studied languages and opera. She loves to be at the heart of the production. This is her second production with TMB, following *The Seagull*. Other credits include *Moonchildren* at the NoHo Arts Center, in collaboration with Columbia College. She is a scenic designer as well and her most recent work was at the Hollywood Bowl. Her scenic artist credits include *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* and *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

Last year more than 1,300 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.
