





The Graziadio Business School accepts California IGETC and CSU courses for transfer into our Bachelor of Science in Management (BSM) degree completion program. Prospective students need at least 60 units to transfer into the BSM program as outlined below. All courses must be completed at a regionally accredited college or university.

Subject	Required Courses	Units Required
ENGLISH	1 course in English Reading & Composition; must have a grade of "C" or better	3 semester units
MATHEMATICS	1 course in Mathematics that must be the equivalent of College Algebra or higher; must have a grade of "C" or better	3 semester units
ARTS AND HUMANITIES	2 courses equivalent to 6 semester units	6 semester units
SOCIAL SCIENCES	2 courses equivalent to 6 semester units	6 semester units
NATURAL SCIENCES	3 semester units; no lab is required	3 semester units; no lab is required
GENERAL EDUCATION	All regionally accredited courses that would satisfy the above categories, as well as Computer Science and up to 4 semester units of Physical Education	Minimum 9 GE semester units
ELECTIVES	All regionally accredited courses satisfy this category	30 semester units

1 courses (3 semester units) such as

General Biology, General Chemistry, Physics, Physical Geography, Physical Anthropology, Marine Science, Oceanography, Ecology, Geology, Earth Science, Microbiology, Physiology, Botany, Zoology, Anatomy, Astronomy, and Meteorology

Unacceptable course: Health

Acceptable CLEP tests: Biology, Chemistry

Acceptable DSST tests

Astronomy, Environment and Humanity (The Race to Save the Planet), Principles of Physical Science I, Physical Geography

English

1 course (3 semester units) such as

Freshman English Composition, College Composition, English Rhetoric, Composition and Literature, Expository Writing, English Expression

Basic Grammar, English as a Second Language, Business English, English Fundamentals.

2 courses (6 semester units) such as
