



April Audia (Gloria), is a graduate of the Theatre Academy. While an Academy student, she appeared in productions of: THE ROSE TATOO, OUR COUNTRY'S GOOD, A PIECE Of MY HEART, and DESIRE, for which she received an Irene Ryan Award nomination. As a Guest Artist she has appeared in THE MAN WHO COULDN'T DANCE and MOON OVER BUFFALO. Locally she has been seen at the Stella Adler Theatre, The Attic Theatre, Two Roads Theatre, California State Los Angeles, Santa Clarita Rep Theatre, The Zephyr Theatre, The Conejo Theatre and many more. Regionally she has worked in New York and several times at the Old Lyric Repertory Company in Utah; a job she originally secured through an audition competition offered to her as a student of the Theatre Academy. Her film credits include: ONCE IN A LIFETIME, FAST TIMES AT RIDGEMONT HIGH, the remake of WHERE THE BOYS ARE, NIGHT RIPPER and WHAT GOES AROUND. Audia's television credits include appearances on: ANDY RICHTER CONTROLS THE UNIVERSE, THE TROUBLE WITH NORMAL, BEYOND CHANCE, THE BOLD AND THE BEAUTIFUL, MELROSE PLACE and THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS. She has also appeared in many commercials. April dedicates this performance to Quentin Drew who taught her about "racism and where you find it" and now that he's free she knows he'll never have to find it again.

Benjamin Clark (Michael) gives his final student performance at the Los Angeles Theatre Academy in VOIR DIRE. He recently performed in the world premiere of the musical THE BRAIN FROM PLANET X. He has been seen around town in the NoHo Cabaret and in Wacky Wednesdays, an improv group that he founded which performs at the Little Fish Theatre. Other recent credits include Kippy in TAKE ME OUT, Richard in FUDDY MEERS and Sgt. Cass in THE SANDSTORM. Benjamin directed HELLO OUT THERE in the Academy's 2007 Student Directed One Acts Festival. "In these halls I have lived lifetimes, some funny, some tragic, all real. I have found love, friends, I have found myself, and above all I have found Art. For all of that I am eternally grateful."

Robert Fisher (Security Officer #1) is a second semester student at the Academy. Previous Academy credits include serving as Stage Manager for NATIONAL PASTIME.

Mike Garcia (Security Officer #2) is a second semester student at the Academy. Previous Academy credits include front of house, concessions and ticket reconciliation.

Lesa Dionne Jacks (Debra) was most recently seen playing Wilma in ROOT OF CHAOS, one of the 2007 Student Directed One Acts. Other credits include Esther in INTIMATE APPAREL. She has also worked on crew for two LACC productions.

James Moody (Lighting Designer/Technical Director) Jim has designed over 130 LORT, Equity Waiver and college productions. He is a member of United Scenic Artist, Local #829 and is also a fellow of U.S. Institute for Theatre Technology (USITT), serving on the Board of Directors for over ten years, currently serving as V.P. for Lighting. He has won numerous awards for his designs and has written a new theatre book, entitled the <u>Business of Theatrical Design</u>, preceded by his ground breaking book, Concert Lighting: Techniques, Art, and Business. He was one of the founders in the field of touring-concert lighting working and was singled out to receive the first Concert Lighting Design of the Year Award. He has worked with music luminaries such as Linda Ronstadt, The Eagles, Electric Light Orchestra, John Denver and Blondie. Most recently, Jim received the Distinguished Lighting Designer award from The United States Institute for Theatre Technology.

Kevin Morrissey (Set Designer) Kevin recently joined the faculty of Los Angeles City College after teaching and designing for over ten years at UC Riverside where he designed scenery, costumes, lighting and sound for over fifty productions. He received a BFA from DePaul University and an MFA from New York University. Kevin has worked extensively in the entertainment industry as a designer for theatre, film, television, and industrial production. Kevin recently worked as the Set Designer for FLIGHT OF THE PHOENIX, a remake of the 1965 classic, starring Dennis Quaid. Other recent credits include Assistant Scenic Designer for the Emmy award-winning production of Peter Pan with Cathy Rigby, and Set Designer for FRASIER, BECKER, THE OLD SETTLER, RESURRECTION BLVD., BABYLON 5, CRUSADE, ED AND HIS DEAD MOTHER, and ELIZABETHTOWN and Assistant to the Production Designer for LIGHT SLEEP-ER. Kevin is a member of both IATSE Local 847 and Local 829, and is currently authoring a book on graphic standards for the entertainment industry with specific attention to the influence of computer-aided design

Olapeju Ogunvankin-Martin (Assistant Director) American born, Nigerian raised, Olapeju is a fifth semester actor at the Theatre Academy. She made her stage debut in the Student Directed One-Act play, "The Long Goodbye" here at LACC. Last fall, she played Mrs. Dickson in INTIMATE APPAREL by Lynn Nottage. Outside of school she has worked on the set of the independent film "The Wager" with Randy Travis. Olapeju is honored to be the Assistant Director of VOIR DIRE by Joe Sutton and would like to thank her husband and most especially God for their never ending support.

Evan Richman (Guest Camera Operator) is a recent graduate of the Theatre Academy. His credits include directing the one-act, THE INDIAN WANTS THE BRONX and performing in ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKŎO'S NEST, BIG LOVE, TOMMY FLOWERS, MOON OVER BUFFALO and THE TAMING OF THE SHREW at the Lillian Theatre. His current film script, "Christmas in Goa" is being considered by several major motion picture studios. Evan would like to express his gratitude to Al Rossi for inviting him to join the VOIR DIRE team. Also, many thanks to cast and crew for all of their hard work and dedication.

Sunshine Romo (Isobel) has previously been seen at the Academy as Jelena in NECESSARY TARGETS, as Meg in THE ACTORS NIGHTMARE and as SENORA SOTO in JULY 7, 1994.

Al Rossi (Director) has performed in over 250 plays, dozens of films, TV shows and commercials, most recently playing the lead role in the film RESILIENCE which will be released later this year. He has directed over 100 plays and musicals at some of the most prominent theatres in the country. He's worked with many fine actors and directors, a few of whom are Charlton Heston, Jessica Tandy and Hume Cronyn, Lynn Redgrave, Alan Alda, Martin Sheen, Dean Martin, Paul Winfield, Cindy Williams, Sir Tyrone Guthrie and Harold Clurman. His directing covers a wide range from classics like KING LEAR, ANTONY AND CLEOPATRA, and AS YOU LIKE IT, to musicals like OKLAHOMA!, COMPANY, and the wrestling musical, TRAFFORD TANZI, which was selected as a Regional Finalist for The American College Theatre Festival. It was his third ACTF production so honored. His direction of the THE GRAPES OF WRATH, OLEANNA, INTIMATE APPAREL and THE WAITING ROOM are other special experiences in his career. VOIR DIRE was written by his former acting student at U C Davis, Joe Sutton, and he dedicates his work on this play to all those on trial in the hope that justice will always be served in the most fair, objective, unbiased, legal, and democratic way possible.

Diane Sisko (Costume Designer) Diane is a graduate of Purdue University. Having been affiliated with the Costurners' Guild, Costume Society of America, and design adjudication for Region VIII of the KC/ACTF, Diane has designed costumes and makeup at the Los Angeles Theatre Academy for many memorable projects including CHER ANTOINE, NICHOLAS NICKLEBY, AMADEUS, ROMEO AND JULIET, MEDEA, MACBETH, AS YOU LIKE IT, the rock version of TWO GENTLEMAN OF VERONA, I THINK WE'RE ALL BONZOS ON THE BUS, ZOMBIE ATTACK!, OUR COUNTRY'S GOOD, NIGHT OF JANUARY 16TH, AFTER THE FALL and THE KENTUCKY CYCLE. She has also worked with Medieval Times, Long Beach City College, and the Living Room Theatre, and the films ROCKETS RED GLARE, and TIN MAN At the Odyssey Theatre she collaborated with Eddie Bledsoe on the award-winning comic costumes for FIVE WOMEN WEARING THE SAME DRESS and with alum Diane Winesburg on RHINOCEROS. For East LA Classic Theatre she designed CYRANO DE BERGERAC and MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING at the John Anson Ford Theatre. Recently she developed the special effects makeup for FOR LOVE OF FREEDOM (TOUISSANT—THE SPIRIT) for Robey Theatre Company.

Darcy Weinberger (Faith) was most recently seen in the 2007 Student Directed One Acts as Ellen in THE ACTORS NIGHTMARE and as The Girl in HELLO OUT THERE.

Jasmine Zozaya (Teresa) most recently served as Director for DIRTY TALK, part of the Student Directed One Acts. Previous acting credits include Nuna in NECESSARY TARGETS.



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This production is entered in the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival (KCACTF). The aims of this national theater education program are to identify and promote quality in college-level theater production. To this end, each production entered is eligible for a response by a regional KCACTF representative, and selected students and faculty are invited to participate in KCACTF programs involving scholarships, internships, grants and awards for actors, directors, dramaturgs, playwrights, designers, stage managers and critics at both the regional and national levels.

Productions entered on the Participating level are eligible for inclusion at the KCACTF regional festival and can also be considered for invitation to the KCACTF national festival at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC in the spring of 2008.

Last year more than 1,300 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.

About the Playwright....

Joe Sutton's plays include The Third Army, As it is in Heaven, Restoring the Sun, and Democracy. His work has been produced by New York Theatre Workshop, BAM, Long Wharf, Old Globe, as well as other theaters around the country and abroad. He was a winner of the FDG/CBS playwriting award, was the recipient of playwriting fellowships from the New York Foundation for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts, and was, for many years, an active member of New Dramatists, which honored him with their annual Joe A. Calloway Award. In addition, his play Voir Dire, which premiered at Seattle Rep, was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize and the Best Play Award of the American Theatre Critics Association. Mr. Sutton teaches at Dartmouth College while maintaining his home in Montelair, NJ, where he lives with his wife, Anne, and their sons, James and Nicholas.


