Women's History Month Virtual Events

Women's History Month is a celebration of women's contributions to history, culture and society and has been observed annually in the month of March in the United States since 1987.

Women's History Month 2021 will take place from Monday, March 1 to Wednesday, March 31, 2021.

The National Museum of American History is presenting *Creating Icons: How We Remember Women's Suffrage* which highlights women's achievements in winning suffrage and invites audiences to explore how our country celebrates milestones in women's history, what people as a nation remember, and who has been forgotten or silenced over time.

Women's History Month Virtual Events

Rightfully Hers: American Women and the Vote **National Archives Museum**, ongoing

Most Americans consider the ability to vote fundamental to the enjoyment of full citizenship. American women, however, were long denied that right. In 1920, American democracy dramatically expanded when the newly ratified 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution prohibited the states from denying the vote on the basis of sex. This landmark voting rights victory was made possible by decades of suffragists' persistent political engagement, and yet it is just one critical milestone in women's battle for the vote. Rightfully Hers: American Women and the Vote highlights the relentless struggle of diverse activists throughout U.S. history to secure voting rights for all American women.

Wonderful Women Creating Change **Smithsonian Libraries and Archives**, March 10, 5-6pm

To celebrate Women's History Month in March and the release of Wonder Woman 1984 (filmed and set at the Smithsonian), the Smithsonian presents Wonderful Women Creating Change. Learn about our own connections to this iconic character and hear what it was really like to be a woman working at the Smithsonian in the 1970s and 1980s.

Lilla Vekerdy, Head and Curator of Special Collections, and Elizabeth Harmon, Digital Curator of the History of Smithsonian Women in Science, will share behind-the-scenes insights into the intriguing contents of our collection of materials from the creator of Wonder Woman, William Moulton Marston, and our fascinating Smithsonian records that document the experiences of real women.
